Background

Silicon Valley Community Foundation is pleased to announce the Dr. James L. Hutchinson and Evelyn Ribbs Hutchinson Medical School Scholarship. One scholarship of up to \$2,000 is awarded annually.

The Hutchinson Medical School Scholarship Fund was established in honor of Dr. and Mrs. Hutchinson by numerous friends, colleagues, patients and community leaders who honored them at a gala dinner in 1994 and, at the same time, contributed generously toward the establishment of this medical school scholarship. Dr. and Mrs. Hutchinson intend the scholarship to assist young people who aspire to attend medical school and to recognize students who demonstrate excellence in both character and academic achievement.

James and Evelyn Hutchinson have been partners and builders of their family and community for more than four decades. Dr. Hutchinson, past president of the local NAACP, was a founding board member of both Planned Parenthood of San Mateo and the Bay Area Urban League.

Dr. Hutchinson's medical practice has always been based on the care of the patient and family as a whole. Known as the "walking doctor" of San Mateo, he started walking 6 to 8 miles a day near his office in 1982. He says that walking helps relieve stress and that being out and about has given him more insight into his community. He has gathered scores of followers in walking for fitness and pleasure.

Eligibility

- Applicant must be a college senior and accepted to medical school or currently enrolled full-time in an accredited medical school program.
- Applicant must demonstrate personal motivation for excellence in both character and academic achievement. Personal integrity, as exemplified by leadership, community involvement and concern for others, will be considered.
- Applicant must have graduated from a high school in San Mateo County or Santa Clara County or have lived in that same area during high school.
- Applicant must be a United States citizen.

Awards will be for one year. Recipients seeking to renew their awards are required to reapply for subsequent funding in competition with other applicants.

Application Deadline

- Silicon Valley Community Foundation must receive the **completed** application packet and **all** supporting materials (personal statement, letters of reference, transcripts, proof of U. S. citizenship and financial statements) **by 5 p.m. on Wednesday, March 7, 2012.**
- Late or incomplete applications will **not** be considered.
- Date of postmark and faxed applications will **not** be considered.

Application Instructions

Silicon Valley Community Foundation 2012 Scholarship Program

Read These Instructions Carefully and Thoroughly.

In order for your application to be considered, all of the following must be received at the community foundation by **5 p.m. on Wednesday, March 7, 2012**. Date of postmark and faxed applications will not be considered. We recommend that you send your application and all of the supporting documents to us in one envelope.

1. Application Form

Applications must be complete to be considered. Attach additional pages if necessary. Attachments do not replace any part of the application. Each section must be completed. Additional sheets for activities, awards and honors, and employment sections must follow the application format.

2. Letters of Reference

Provide **two** letters of reference **only**.

- One letter from a teacher or academic advisor
- One letter from a work or volunteer supervisor, a community leader or personal acquaintance

Letters from teachers, advisors and employers must be on school or company letterhead. All letters must be **signed and dated**. Photocopies are acceptable. Letters may be sealed in their own envelopes.

3. Transcripts of Grades

The application must include an **official** college transcript. If you have taken medical school courses, an **official** medical school transcript must also be included for all work completed. **Photocopies and copies from the Internet are unacceptable**. A copy of a high school transcript or other proof of graduation from a high school in San Mateo County or Santa Clara County must also be included.

4. Signed and Dated Personal Statement

In addition to completing this application form, the applicant must write a statement of at least 500 words, but no longer than 850 words (approximately 2-3 pages, double-spaced). In the statement, you should:

- Describe yourself to the scholarship committee.
- Describe your long- and short-range goals.
- Indicate why you want to go to medical school.
- Describe your community involvement.
- Describe events which demonstrate your personal motivation, integrity and concern for others.
- Reflect upon any challenges you have faced and how you responded to them.
- **Sign and date your personal statement.**

5. Financial Need

Need is not a primary consideration of the *Dr. James L. Hutchinson and Evelyn Ribbs Hutchinson Medical School Scholarship*, but may be a factor in final selection. Evidence of financial need must be submitted with all application packets.

Extra consideration will be given to self-supporting students and candidates demonstrating extreme financial need.

If you submitted your Free Application for Federal Financial Aid or FAFSA, enclose a copy of all pages of your 2012-2013 Student Aid Report or SAR (updated information regarding your FAFSA application can be found online at www.fafsa.ed.gov/).

OR

If you did not apply for federal financial aid, enclose a copy of the first two pages of your or your parent's/guardian's most recent Form 1040.

6. Proof of Citizenship

Proof of United States citizenship (photocopy of birth certificate, passport or naturalization papers) must accompany your application.
